Dear Lawrence Lem:

This letter is in response to your recent request and will act as your authorization to import various types of plant material not prohibited in accordance with 7 CFR319 for analysis and/or production purposes. This would include desiccated, processed, chemically stabilized (i.e. lyophilized tissue), and frozen plant material. This notification does not include the importation of fresh plant material capable of propagation. For reference the following url is a link to the Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) Title 7:

You are responsible for ensuring compliance with regulations promulgated under the authority of other statutes by the State and other Federal agencies that may apply to your proposed action (e.g., State Departments of Agriculture, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Services, etc.).

Upon arrival in the United States, the plant materials will be subject to inspection by representatives of Customs and Border Protection, Agriculture Quarantine Inspection (CBP, AQI). A CBP-AQI representative will examine the samples and if they are found to be free from exotic pests, diseases, noxious weeds, soil, and other prohibited matter will be released to you.
